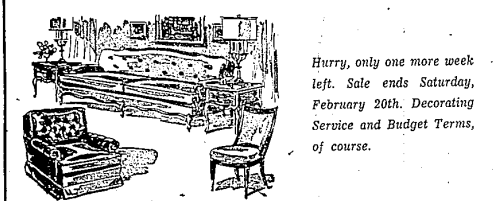


First Social Event Planned by St. Gerald's Ladies

St. Gerald's Parish is the name of the new church at Farmington Rd. near 8 Mile. Its actual boundaries are Drake Rd. to Tuck Rd. and Merriman Rd. to Tuck Rd. It serves 375 families in both Farmington and Livonia.
Rev. James P. O'Hagan is beginning his first term with the parish. He has a solid background, however, he was assistant at the Trenton Church Dec. 19. Four monsignors and nearly 70 priests were there to commemorate the occasion. The church has a brand new rectory with an office and reception room for visitors.
After talking with Father O'Hagan, one learns that despite his easy, gentle manner he is an extremely progressive young man. He has served on several community relations boards and sat at several round tables. He is well aware of the current problems that beset a new community, and has a modern point of view toward their solution.
When we asked him about his chief work in the new parish however, his answer was simply "to do God's work in this community."

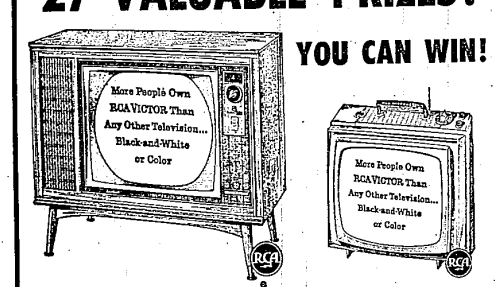
