A campaign for signatures on fair housing covenant cards will be conducted during Brother-hood Week by the Farmington Human Relations Council.

The cards, which include a statement against discrimination in housing, will be available from Council members and cooperating churches. Brotherhood Week is Feb. 21 through 28.

"The covenant cards give those who favor equality in housing an opportunity to band together around a simple statement of belief," said John Millhone, council chairman.

"They have been used elsewhere to show a desire to accept changes in housing patterns peacefully and with good will."
