

Religious Services of Three Major Faiths Will Highlight Girl Scout Week

The Metropolitan Detroit Council will open activities for national Girl Scout Week March 7-13, 1965, with special religious services for members and their families of the Catholic, Protestant and Jewish faiths, according to Mrs. William E. Wilson, council president.

The first major Vesper Service scheduled for Girl Scout Sunday in the Detroit area will be held on March 7 at the Metropolitan Detroit Council, 800 Woodward Avenue.

The 21st annual Holy Hour, sponsored by the Detroit Archdiocesan Catholic Committee on Scouting, will be conducted on Sunday, March 7, at 4 p.m. in the University of Detroit Memorial Building.

Synagogues throughout the Detroit area will hold special services on March 6 for Girl Scouts and their families.

The public is invited to join the services.

Girl Scouts and their families for the Holy Hour and Vesper Service. A total attendance of over 12,000 is expected at the two services.

In announcing the Girl Scout Sunday program, Mrs. Wilson said, "It is the spiritual force behind Girl Scouting which gives life and meaning to its activities. Living with her promise to 'try to do my duty to God' is an essential part of a Girl Scout's experience. Through the Girl Scout's spiritual life, Girl Scouting encourages each girl to become a stronger member of her own religious group. We are most grateful to the United Church Women and to the Detroit Archdiocesan Committee for sponsoring the Girl Scout Sunday services."

Programs of the Holy Hour and the Vesper Service will recognize and feature Girl Scouts who have earned religious awards for the United Church Women of Detroit, in cooperation with the Metropolitan Detroit Council, developed the Alpha Omega Award for the Catholic faith. A similar award is presented to Girl Scouts of the Jewish faith.

Designated the Menorah Award, it has also been available for many years on a national level.

According to Mrs. Wilson, it was not until 1962 that local Girl Scouts of the major Protestant faiths could earn a religious award. Since there is no national organization for all Protestant groups, the United Church Women of Detroit, in cooperation with the Metropolitan Detroit Council, developed the Alpha Omega Award for the Catholic faith. All religious awards for Girl Scouts recognize outstanding service to church or synagogue; require a broad knowledge of the history and beliefs of the individual girl's religious affiliation and participation in church or synagogue activities; and specify that the Girl Scout must show evidence of a spiritual force as a guiding factor in her life. Awards are under the supervision of the individual girl's priest, minister or rabbi. Presentation is made at an appropriate religious service.
