

Junior High Musicians Win 88 Medals At Event

Musicians from Plymouth's Junior High Schools won a total of 88 awards Saturday at the District 12 annual solo and ensemble festival in Garden City at which more than 2,000 junior high instrumental pupils from the area participated.

The contest is sponsored by the Michigan School Band and Orchestra Association and ratings are on the basis of bronze medal and blue ribbon for first division or superior performance; a stellar medal and red ribbon for a second division or excellent rating.

The judging panel included teachers from high schools, colleges, symphonies and professional instructors. District 12 includes Washtenaw, Macomb and Wayne counties outside of the City of Detroit.

The Plymouth musicians won 41 blue and 47 red ribbons.
