2,000 Expected to Enroll in Livonia Adult Ed Program

Nearly two thousand suburbanites will enroll this week in more than 150 evening school courses offered in the Livonia school district.

Following a cooperative suburban policy adopted by the Livonia Board of Education, hobby and recreational courses will be the same for residents and non-residents of Livonia.

"By opening our doors to all of our suburban neighbors we make possible a wider choice of continuing education opportunities for those living in the Livonia school district," John Anderson, evening school director said. "Such cooperation helps all persons in this part of the metropolitan area get a better education. Persons living in Farmington, Northville, Garden City, Plymouth, and other local areas can take advantage of a hundred courses from dressmaking to television troubleshooting for the same fee as Livonians.

Only exception, Anderson pointed out, are charges made for high school academic classes, wherein non-residents are assessed \$12.00 and residents \$6.50. These fees were reduced this year by about 50 per cent.

In the area of fine arts suburbanites have their choice of a score of courses. They are: Modern Creative Dance for Adults, Community Band, three groups of Guitar, Piano Instruction, Flower Arranging, Vocal Techniques, Drawing and Sketching, Water Color and Pastel Painting, Beginning Oil Painting, Continuation of Beginning Oil Painting, Landscape Painting, Portrait Painting, Studio Painting, China Painting, Sculpture in Metal, Commercial Art Techniques, and Theatre Guild of Livonia-Redford.

Business education courses offered in Bryant, Riley, Emerson junior high school and at Bentley and Franklin High schools are:

Bookkeeping and Accounting, Business English, Introduction to Data Processing, Business Machines, Basic Computer Programming, A B C Stenographic Shorthand I and ABC Stenographic Dictation II, Beginning Gregg Shorthand, Beginning Gregg Dictation 40-80 and Gregg Shorthand Refresher 60-80, Beginning Typewriting I and II, Intermediate Typewriting, and Advanced Electric Typewriting.

A number of courses in general fields, in languages and in liberal arts to be offered in the Spring term, which starts the week of March 22, include: Citizenship, English for the Foreign Born, French II, German, Russian I and II, Spanish I and II, Italian, Your Vocabulary, Public Speaking, Review of Grammar, Marriage and Family Problems, Psychology just for You, Care and Problems of the Retarded Child, Meteorology for Pilots, and Nature Study.

Among the score of more classes in home and family education offered are:

Beginning Cake Decorating, Party Cooking, Oriental Cookery, Steamlined Housekeeping, Draperies and Slip Covers, Bug Hooking and Braiding, Knitting, Advanced Knitting and Charting, Millinery, Bibop Sewing Techniques, Dressmaking, Beginning Sewing, Dress Design

and Pattern Making, Tailoring, and Personality Plus.

Do-it-yourself hobbyists who delve in the practical arts and choose courses in:

Auto Tune-Up, Auto Care and Maintenance for Women, Basic Blue Print Reading, Ceramics, Drafting, Electronics II and V, Furniture Refinishing, Hair Trimming for Children, Math for Shop (beginning), Photographic Techniques, Machine Shop, Advanced Pottery Techniques, Radio-Code and Theory, Radio and TV Troubleshooting, Buyers Guide for Home Construction, Power Machines, Perennial Home Gardening, and Upholstery.

Suburbanites who believe in physical fitness and want to pursue health and safety education with others interested in the same goals can enroll in such courses as:

Safe Boat Handling, Standard First Aid, Driver Education for Adults, Physical Fitness for Men and Women, Slim and Trim for Women, Yoga exercises, Judo I and II, Swimming for Men, Swimming for Women in Shallow Water, Deep Water Swimming for Women, Synchronized Swimming, Senior Life Saving, Skin Diving, Camping Techniques and Equipment, Tennis, Beginning Golf, and Intermediate Golf.

Men and women living in western metropolitan suburban areas can get more information about these and other courses by phoning KE 7-4553 or GA 2-1200. A complete schedule of offerings, fees required, and location of the classes will be mailed to all interested.

Registration will be taken at Bentley High School, Hubbard Road at Five Mile, one week, through Friday, March 19th. Classes begin the week of March 22.

Boys Baseball Ready to Go

Saturday, March 20, is the registration date for all Little League players who will be playing in the North Farmington Baseball for Boys, Inc. group.

Registration will take place at Duncel School, Farmington, from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. for all T-Ball, Minors, Majors, Pony and Adult entrants.

Boys from eight years (including those who will be eight by August 31, 1965) up to the age of 16 are eligible to register. Those who have not played in the North Farmington League in the past will have to present a copy of their birth certificate at the time of registration.

The fee is \$10 per boy and \$5 for each additional brother. This includes a free physical examination and those who cannot be present on March 20 will have to be examined by their personal physician and their physical report attached to their registration card and taken to the home of Joe Kilmer, 28872 Glenarden, Farmington, who is the treasurer of the league.

Posters and registration cards will be placed in area schools that North Farmington Little League covers.

Boys within the following area boundaries are eligible to register with the North Farmington Baseball for Boys, Inc., Little League, 11 Mile Road on the South, Pontiac Trail and Long Lake Road on the North, Inkster Road on the East, Haggerty Road from 11 Mile to 13 Mile, Drake from 13 Mile to Pontiac Trail on the West.

Fire Damages Clubhouse at Crestwood Apt.

Fire of an undetermined origin partially destroyed the combination clubhouse-bathhouse at the Crestwood Apartments, on Sheldon Road, early Monday evening.

Assistant Chief George Schoenmann reported the blaze apparently started in the gas furnace and quickly spread along the side walls and into the rafters.

The Plymouth Fire Department sent out four pieces of equipment and had the fire under control within a half hour. Then, just when everything appeared to be serene, the fire broke out again some two hours later and the firefighters had to make a second run.

The Crestwood Apartments were the scene of a blaze in one of the apartments three weeks ago, causing a furor that found the City Commission checking the present building code with a thought of tightening rules in several sections to avoid possibility of future trouble in apartments that are on the planning board or under construction.
