## Passover Commemorates Jews Flight from Egypt

With its colorful ceremonies that mark the flight of the Israelites from ancient Egypt, as related in the biblical Book of Exodus, Passover, the Jewish festival of freedom begins this year at sundown, Friday, April 16.

The Seder is the most salient feature of the Passover holiday, which is observed for seven days by Reform Jews and eight days by Conservative and Orthodox Jews. It is a meal combined with a home worship service. The story of the exodus from Egypt is told at the dinner table.

The table is set with foods and objects that symbolize the bondage of the Jews from Egypt. They are:

- The shank bone symbolizing the paschal sacrifice during the spring pilgrimage to the Temple in Jerusalem;
- The matza symbolizing the unleavened bread which the Jews ate during their hurried flight from Egypt;

- The bitter herbs symbolizing the bitterness of slavery.

A sprig of parsley on the special Seder plate reminds those assembled that Passover is also a festival of spring. A roasted shank-bone is used as an emblem of the paschal lamb, and the charoset, a mixture of apples, nuts, raisins, cinnamon and wine, symbolizes the mortar from which the Israelites made bricks for the Egyptian pyramids.

The youngest child asks four

traditional questions about the holiday, and the remainder of the service is devoted to a response by the family out of the Haggadah, or Passover narrative. These are also traditional songs.

Moses is the great figure in the saga of Passover, yet it is not his life's story that preoccupies the worshiper in the holiday.

Passover is the time Jews celebrate the joys of liberty and draw parallels between the hardships they underwent in Egypt and in later persecutions during the thousands of

years of their history. The emphasis, however, is always on ultimate deliverance and hope for the future.

With minor variations in the forms of the service and foods served, Passover is celebrated by Jews throughout the world, and in the spirit of the event welcome strangers to the festive table with reflections on the theme of freedom.

At Temple Beth Am a Passover service will be held April 17 at 10:30 a.m. in the United Hebrew Schools' building, Rabbi David Jessel will conduct it.

## Area Women Combine to Aid Patna Missions

The Very Rev. Louis De Genova, S.J., Provincial of the Patna, India Province of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), will be honored at a "Farewell Reception and Donation Tea" on April 25 at the Fries Ballroom of the Grosse Pointe War Memorial Center.

For the past 45 years the Jesuit Fathers of the Detroit Province have been assigned by the Pope to the largest single Mission in the Catholic Church—Patna, India and the Kingdom of Nepal. The area is 86,000 square miles and numbers 44,000,000 people.

Jesuit American and Indian personnel numbers 281. The

Jesuits conduct and supervise 41 Main Mission Stations, 114 sub-stations, five hospitals and 180 clinics, six high schools and 147 Mission schools with 19,800 students. There are 33,500 Catholics in the area.

The donations received at the reception will be used for the most pressing needs of Patna Mission with one half equally divided among the Missionaries especially adopted by the Patna Jesuit Mission Circle of the Metropolitan Detroit area.

The Blessed Peter Faber Circle of the Mission Service draws for its members from the Livonia-Garden City area.

Early during his Jesuit training, the Very Rev. Louis De Genova volunteered for Mission work in Patna. The outbreak of World War II delayed his departure in the Fall of 1939. During this waiting period he taught at the University of Detroit.

In March, 1940, he arrived in Patna. Ordination to the Priesthood took place in the Indian Highlands on Nov. 21, 1943. The fourteen years following his training were spent in the Bush Mission Station in Mokameh, Patna, India.

On June 10, 1952, he was appointed the first Provincial of the Patna Province of the Society of Jesus.

The Very Rev. John A. McGrail, S.J., Provincial of the Detroit Province of the Society of Jesus, will also be present at the reception.
