## Concert to Open 'Symphony Week'

The Livonia Youth Symphony Society, will open "Symphony Week" in Livonia and surrounding communities at a concert by the Livonia Youth Symphony Orchestra, Lester Farkas conducting, Sunday, May 16, at 4 p.m. in the Franklin High School auditorium.

Featured guest with the Symphony Orchestra will be the Bentley High School Concert Band under the direction of Robert A. Clark. Judy Shirley and Linda Taylor, two scholarship winners from the Youth Symphony Orchestra, will appear on the program as soloists.

Following opening remarks by Benton Yates, Livonia's Superintendent of Schools, conductor Robert A. Clark and the 80-piece Concert Band will open the program with "Fanfare of Unity" by Richards. The band will also do "Overture to Beatrice and Benedict" by Berlioz, "Waltzes from Der Rosenkavalier" by R. Strauss, and "Selections from Mary Poppins" by Sherman.

Clark, who has led the conductor of the Bentley Concert Band since 1954, was the first president of the Livonia Youth Symphony Society in 1957.

Lester Farkas and the Livonia Youth Symphony Orchestra will present Mozart's "Flute Overture" and "Capriccio Espagnole" by Rimsky-Korsakoff. The harpist for the final number will be Mary Alice Malaski.

Steve Polgar, Livonia's City Attorney and a member of the board of directors of the Livonia Youth Symphony Society, will present special certificates to the senior graduating members of the Livonia Youth Symphony Orchestra.

The official historical record of the Livonia Youth Symphony Society, Inc., the "Blue Book," will be dedicated at a ceremony following the award presentation. Tickets for this concert may be obtained at the door. Students will be admitted free.

An Appreciation Concert on Sunday, May 23, at the Franklin High School will close Symphony Week, 1965. This program will include performances by the Society's two Youth Orchestras and displays by various cultural organizations in Livonia.
