It was one of five Plymouth safeties in the game.

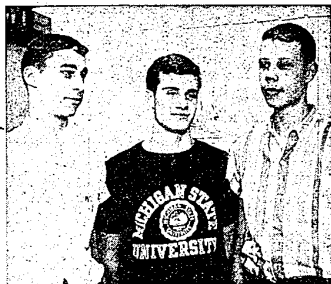
Redford Union bounced back from its loss to Bentley and beat out Belleville, 4-2, as Rick Fisher hurled perfect ball until he was out in the sixth.
