Two hundred and fifty-two schools throughout the country entered the contest. The judging was conducted at the American Sunday School Association offices in Chicago.

The Newburg Baptist Church Sunday School consists of seven divisions from cradle roll adults. In the first three divisions a basic course of instruction is taught. Beginning with the Junior level, one book of the Bible is taught at all the different levels each year.

Teachers utilize felt boards for exhibits, music and Bibles during instruction. Classes meet in several different rooms in the church building.

Roy Cline, Christian Educational Director at the church, stated that he believed that there have been five major accomplishments through participation in the contest.

"First, many adults came under the impact of the gospel. Secondly," he continued, "the hearts of the workers were challenged as they saw the results of their labors."

"Third, attendance increased during the contest and has maintained at a steady level beyond the average period of the contest," according to Mr. Cline.

"Fourth, the need for added facilities was magnified and plans have been made for a new sanctuary seating 500 and last, the contest provided a great occasion for praise, honor, and glory to God in the entire church."

Rev. Warford reports that the church considers its visitation programs as the prime factor in its success, but it is equally proud that more than 3,000 pieces of literature was distributed from the church office.
