### What To Do In A Tornado

You are in the house, alone or with your children. A warning comes that there is a tornado on the way. The difference in what you do may mean life or death. Ideally, you should seek immediate shelter in a tornado shelter but these are few and far between. Keep in mind the following rules, set up for you by the Oakland County Office of Civil Defense. They may save your life:

First and foremost, stay away from windows.

The southwest corner of the basement offers the greatest safety. Doors and windows on the north and east sides of the house may be opened to prevent damage.

If your house has NO basement, find shelter in a storm shelter or under a depression like a ditch or ravine.

If you are in the country, lie flat in the nearest depression such as a ditch or ravine.

Stay away from auditoriums or gymnasiums during a tornado. Stay inside, away from windows remain near an inside wall on the lower floor if necessary.

Above all don't panic, and keep your radio tuned on for information on the progress of the tornado.

If a tornado is upon you, here are the immediate danger signals: a funnel shaped cloud, spinning rapidly and extending toward the earth from the base of a thundercloud. When close by, it sounds like the roar of hundreds of airplanes.

The chief causes of destruction are the violent winds which uproot trees, destroy buildings and create a serious hazard from objects blown through the air.

These protective measures stay away from auditoriums or gymnasiums during a tornado. Stay inside, away from windows remain near an inside wall on the lower floor if necessary.

Above all don't panic, and keep your radio tuned on for information on the progress of the tornado.

### Expect More Arrests Of Southfield Raiders

The Murdock case may broaden soon, according to Southfield Detective Cass W. Gaska. The home belonging to 84-year-old Agnes Murdock and her 60 year old son Charles, at 26100 W. McNichols in Southfield was raided by teenagers, on May 1. Five youths have so far been arrested.

The Southfield Police are still looking for two youths who they believe participated in the raid. The two have been named in the present warrant, but their names have not been made public. One of them is believed to have been struck by a hatchet wielded by Mr. Murdock in an effort to drive the gang out.

In addition, the Southfield Police have requested of the Oakland County Prosecutor warrants against a number of other youths who gathered outside the home during the raid. According to Gaska, this group "contributed to the mob atmosphere, which led to the raid, and could have prevented it, or at least made a phone call, which would have kept the damage to a minimum."

### Will Buy Bus Chassis

Farmington Public School District has agreed to purchase five bus chassis from International Harvester who offered a low bid of \$14,840.10.

An additional amount of \$90 for each bus for front heaters and \$12 per bus for a right windshield fan will be added to the cost.

More than \$14,000 in federal grants to assist "Operation Head Start" preschool programs for disadvantaged youngsters was announced in Washington, D.C., Tuesday by Congressman Billie S. Farnum.

The grant includes \$10,763 for Livonia Schools, which will be matched by \$1,200 of local funds. 70 children will benefit. In Farmington, a \$3,420 federal grant will be matched by \$975 in local funds.
