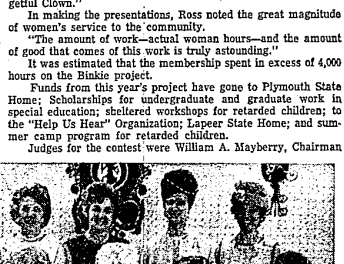

As a special reward for Redford Suburban League members on Thursday, May 13, their president attended the Federal's Club Achievement Awards luncheon for 150 club women and civic leaders at the Veterans Memorial Building. Alfred Glancy, Jr., Chairman of the Board and Joseph Ross, President of Federal Department stores awarded \$3,500 in cash prizes to these club representatives. In the Class A division Redford Suburban League was presented second prize, \$500 for their children's book "Binkie The Forgetful Clown."

In making the presentations, Ross noted the great magnitude of women's service to the community. "The amount of work—actual woman hours—and the amount of good that comes of this work is truly astounding." It was estimated that the membership spent in excess of 4,000 hours on the Binkie project. Funds from this year's project have gone to Plymouth State Home; scholarships for underprivileged and graduate work in special education; sheltered workshops for retarded children; to the "Help Us Hear" Organization; Lapeer State Home; and summer camp program for retarded children.
