

Plymouth State Home, Northville Hospital Share \$70,000 Federal Aid Grants

Congressman Billie S. Farnum has announced that the Department of Health, Education and Welfare has made a one-year \$20,166 grant—the start of a five-year \$100,000 program—to the Plymouth State Home and Northville Hospital. The money will be used to train personnel in up-to-date methods of caring for mental retardation patients. Approximately 325 persons will become more skilled if the program is renewed annually for the planned five-year period, Farnum said.



She speculates that she will probably be sent either to Chicago or one of the Western states, where she will be involved in "inter-racial teaching."

An English major, history minor, Janet served as Student Council president during her senior year. She has had many hours of experience in the teaching field, including working with emotionally disturbed children at the Wayne County Training School. Miss Henry is presently teaching History and English to grades nine and ten at the Divine Child High school. In volunteering a year's service to the needy poor of America, Janet said that for today's "new breed it's either total commitment or nothing."

Ruth Przelawski, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Przelawski of 608 Long Lake Avenue, Alpena, Michigan, will be a June graduate of Madonna College. After her orientation program Ruth expects to teach in the Appalachian area.

Ruth, a biology major and English minor, first heard of the lay apostolate through the Extension magazine, and became more interested in the project when Father Sullivan spoke of the great need of dedicated service to relieve conditions in economically deprived areas.

Letter Carriers Plan Field Day
