

Registration Opens for Crippled Children's Camp

Registration forms for the summer day camp for crippled children, to be held at the Easter Seal Center, near Michigan and Middlebelt are ready now, according to Richard J. Dancoski, who will serve as program director. Children between the ages of 5-16 years who are physically handicapped will be enrolled for one week between July 6 and August 6, and for longer periods if possible. The aim of the camp is to give physically handicapped youngsters some of the recreational experiences enjoyed by their peers. Teen-age volunteers, sixteen years of age or older give assistance in games, music, dramatics, crafts, and excursions to nearby public pools for swimming. Parents interested in enrolling their youngsters in camp and teen-agers interested in volunteering may see registration forms by calling the Easter Seal Center, Parkway 2-3055. The summer program is one of the services financed from contributions received as a result of the annual distribution of Easter Seals and related activities.
