

# Survey To Help Establish Curriculum at New Community College

What will be the curriculum basis at Wayne County's new Community College?

More than 250 businesses and industries in the 38 school districts in the new College district are busy filling out a four-page community college questionnaire.

Survey data will be used by the Program Needs Committee of the College Citizens' Participatory Study Committee as a basis for the recommended curriculum of the proposed college.

By this week, the surveys are scheduled to be returned to Study Director Dr. Robert Keene, Redford Township, of the Wayne Co. Intermediate School District.

Besides Redford Union and South Redford School Districts, others participating in The Observer's circulation area include all school districts not now affiliated with Schoolcraft Community College.

The business-industry survey is the final study questionnaire in a series of three done by the community college study committee to determine the curricula that could be offered in a local community college for 38 school districts in the Detroit metropolitan area.

Members of the June, 1965 graduating class, almost 30,000 in the public and parochial schools, were first queried as to their future educational and vocational plans. A mail survey of the 1963 public and parochial school graduates added another 22,000 pertinent comments by post-high school youth as to what they would want educationally and vocationally in the proposed community college curricula.

Since the curricula offered at a community college is vital to the economic and social well being of our county, much time and effort by citizens members of the Program Needs Committee has been spent in discovering the interest and needs of the youth in the area as well as the business-industrial firms.

Data furnished by the three surveys involving some 50,000 individuals will assist the committee in the formulation of recommended programs that will be followed in the Wayne County community college district.

Four committees (Program Needs, Site and Housing, Finance and Publicity) are preparing reports for a final general session on June 24 at Riverdale High School in Dearborn Heights. These final reports will contain the citizens' recommendations to be given to the Wayne County Intermediate Board of Education in the following areas:

- a) Potential college enrollments
- b) Number of campuses and types of facilities needed
- c) The finances required to support the community college district
- d) The curricula that should

be offered, based on the demands of the youth, adults, business and industry. Midsummer has been set for the final report of the community college study by the Wayne County Citizens' Participatory Study Committee. After completion of the study, an application will be made to the Superintendent of Public Instruction for his approval to hold a community college.
