

Four Catholic Priests Named to Area Posts

In changes of appointments announced last week by the Detroit Archdiocese, the Office of the Secretary of the Archdiocese, the following appointments were made:

Fr. Thomas W. Bissonette, a newly ordained priest, was named assistant pastor at Our Lady of Sorrows in Farmington.

St. Robert Bellarmine's received two new assistant pastors, Fr. Thomas B. Rodial and Fr. Charles B. Sourenfield.

Fr. Leo Thomas Lukko, the first graduate of St. Valentine's School in Redford Township to be ordained a few weeks ago, was assigned to St. Florian's parish in Hamtramck.

'Areas of Agreement' Cited By Christian Scientists

The Christian Science Board of Directors today urged its church members to find the "areas of agreement" which exist with other denominations.

"rather than think of ourselves as entirely different or exclusive."

From the church's earliest beginnings, said the Directors, it has been deeply involved in the "search for the real source of unity."

The message was presented before several thousand members at the annual meeting of The Mother Church, The First Church of Christ, Scientist, in Boston, last Monday.

Local congregations of The First Church of Christ, Scientist are: the Fourth and Eighth Churches in Detroit; the First Church in Plymouth; the First Church in Farmington; and the First Church in Garden City.

"On the basis of its spiritual Christian Science has much in common with other denominations," the message noted.

"To every honest adherent of any God-centered faith sincerely working to uplift and unify the human race, we offer our fellowship and support."

"Today we are confronted with one of history's deepest, most divisive social upheavals," the Directors continued.

"Marking this upheaval is the churning drive of the individual to find the real meaning of life and to establish this legitimate place and identity in an increasingly complex and impersonal society."

"Social and governmental organizations as such do not make the necessary connection with the individual or enable him to meet his real needs. Helpful and important as these efforts are, they are not enough. They do not get at the root of the trouble," said the Directors.

The working basis of Christian Science, the message stated, is "the understanding of God as divine Love, all-inclusive Spirit, is the one force that can truly hold men together in understanding and harmony."

Jesus "was never exclusive," the message noted. "He preached world evangelism. . . His life of love drew the multitudes to him and established the basis for Christianity—the religion of love, the religion capable of uniting all peoples of all times."

The annual election of a new church president by the Directors was also announced at the meeting. Mrs. Francis S. Wells, C.S.B., of San Antonio, Texas, took over as presiding officer from the retiring president, Edward Froderman of Chicago, Ill. Both of them also hold positions on the Board of Trustees of The Christian Science Publishing Society.

In reports to the meeting by the managers of various church departments, it was disclosed that the number of Christian Science branch churches had reached the 3,300 mark with recent additions in Argentina, The Netherlands, New Zealand, and for the first time, in Guatemala and Korea.

Local Man Attended Convention

Mr. and Mrs. John Badalutz, 45085 Mayo Court, Northville, recently attended the three-day convention of Jehovah's Witnesses in Ypsilanti.

Badalutz, who serves as assistant presiding minister in the local congregation of Jehovah's Witnesses, reported that more than a thousand persons heard Mr. J. W. Filson, District Supervisor of Jehovah's Witnesses, deliver the convention highlight lecture, "The Moral Breakdown, What Can Be Done About It?"

Filson said that "Moral breakdown" does not imply anarchy; it may be co-existence with a government. But there is a widespread tendency to disregard conservative standards of behavior and follow instead what is popular even in reckless defiance of the law."

"The three-day met featured lectures, skills and staged dramatizations," Badalutz explained, "designed to improve the individual ability of witnesses to teach the Bible as they engage in their regular home visitation work in their neighborhoods."

Livonian To Visit East Africa This Summer

Forty-one-year old Chet Richard of Livonia is a man who takes his Christian duties seriously.

This summer Richard, of 31140 Westfield, Livonia, will leave his wife, Marianne, and three children, Christopher, Craig, and Carol Anne, and spend two months meeting and talking with residents of East Africa.

"Person to person communication is important especially in Africa which is growing so tremendously. The various news media are fine," Richard comments, "but in reading since I was selected I have the impression that Africans' views are distorted. Contact from layman to layman is best."

Richard, a teacher in the Wayne School, told about how he attended an area conference of the Men's Council of the Presbyterian Church last March in Pittsburgh. At that conference the work of a group of Presbyterian laymen last summer in Gabon was described.

"One of the things that was brought out that really started me thinking," he said, "was the fact that Africans were surprised to find American people as members of the group working in Gabon."

Richard is one of 12 United Presbyterian Laymen that will form part of an interracial team fostering Christian goodwill and works in Africa.

He will visit East Africa with five other laymen. Three other teachers, a carpenter and the

executive secretary of the Los Angeles YWCA will make up the team.

Six other Presbyterian laymen will visit West Africa and participate in a work project in the Cameroons.

Richard's group will visit Egypt, Sudan, Kenya, Uganda, Tanganyika, North and South Rhodesia, Congo Republic, Republic of the Congo, Gabon, Cameroons, Nigeria and Ghana.

They will spend two weeks on a work project in Kenya and participate in visitations with African churchmen in the other countries.

Both groups will meet for a six-day African American laymen's conference at the Middle Ecumenical Foundation in Kilwa, Zambia.

The project is co-sponsored by the National Council of United Presbyterian Men and the Commission on Ecumenical Mission and Relations of the United Presbyterian Church.

to be better representatives of the faith in the nations of the world.

Richard is a member of St. Paul's Presbyterian Church in Livonia. He is the immediate past president of the St. Paul's Men's Council and has taught in the church school.

Expenses for the trip are being underwritten by Richard, St. Paul's, local chapters of United Presbyterian Men in the metropolitan area and by the Committees of Presbytery.

The team will leave New York June 25 and return August 27.
