Display Muskets

Rifles and muskets made by pioneer Michigan craftsmen of the 19th century are now on exhibit at the Detroit Historical Museum. Woodard and Kirby, Continuing through Oct. 3, visitors can see examples of firearms made in 32 Michigan Communities from 1830-1850. Some 50 weapons are displayed, representing the craftsmanship of 39 gunsmiths. Eleven examples were made in Detroit. Various types of weapons including the flintlock and percussion lock are shown, along with combinations of rifles and shotguns. Single barreled and double barreled rifles and shotguns are also included. Others of interest have percussion hammers on the ends of the barrels and were called "mule-ears" or "sideappers." Still others are more ornate and are inlaid with silver and brass. The tools used in making these weapons form an interesting part of the exhibition. Tools used for wood working and metal working clearly attest to the riverer's artistic ability of early Michigan gunsmiths. The Detroit Historical Museum is open Tuesday through Sunday from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Closed Monday. Admission free.

Bellini Work Featured During July

Rich in bold color contrasts, Giovanni Bellini's "Madonna and Child" is The Detroit Institute of Arts featured painting of the month for July. Signed by the artist, and dated 1509, it is a work of Bellini's late period, executed seven years before his death. During the Renaissance, magnificent glowing color found its most sumptuous expression in the work of Bellini, but it is also evident in the work of his teacher, Giovanni Bellini. Bellini's use of color is both expressive and a delight to the eye. In religious subjects, such as this Madonna and Child, he uses it to achieve a sense of harmony between earthly and spiritual realm. The Bellini "Madonna and Child" is in Gallery 10 of The Detroit Institute of Arts. Brief talks on the painting will be given by members of the museum's Education Department on Wednesdays and Fridays during July at 12:45 p.m. Summer visiting hours at the museum are 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday. The museum is closed on Mondays and holidays.

'Art: USA' Talks Slated At Institute

A special series of gallery talks at The Detroit Institute of Arts' current exhibition, "ART: USA" will be given throughout July by Joseph Messing, the exhibition's curator. After accompanying "Art: USA" on its European tour of 14 countries, where it was seen by nearly 300,000 visitors during a two and a half year period, Messing is completely knowledgeable regarding the 102 contemporary American paintings in the collection in which abstract and realistic trends are equally well represented. His Detroit Institute of Arts gallery talks, which are open to the public without charge, will be given on Tuesdays at 10:30 p.m. and Thursdays at 10:30 a.m. He will also conduct general tours of the exhibition on Tuesdays at 10:30 a.m. and Thursdays at 1:30 p.m. "Art: USA" will be at The Detroit Institute of Arts through Aug. 1. The museum is open daily except Mondays and holidays, from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Farmington Sets Free Band Concert

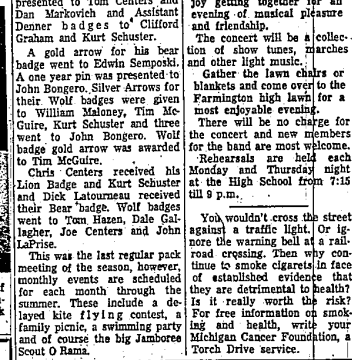
