The letter also stated that school taxes in the amount of \$934.84 would be lost should the local dealer sell the dairy.

Two board members, Sylvia Schwartz and George Lishfield went to Grand Rapids Saturday and still favored keeping the business in the community even though the local bidder was not low. Richard Peters also voted to award the bid to Farmington Dairy two weeks ago but was overruled by a majority of the board in refusing to reverse the decision Monday evening.

Vernon Fisher entered the discussion offering strong support for awarding the contract to the lowest acceptable bidder. All competitive bids were called for.

Peters offered a motion which was seconded by Barbara Brown calling for a letter to be written to each of the persons signing the petition that the proposed letter would explain the competitive bidding procedures that the Board has followed. The motion was supported by Peters, Leland Clifford and Barbara Neal Naisbitt and Mrs. Schwartz voted in favor.

The protest letter was signed by Herbie's of Farmington, Welsh House of Music, Sidney Robbins of Penny Wise, Courtney Bradley Pharmacy, Norma Monroy, Dr. H. Teel, Margaret McGreavey, Daniel S.
