

Diesel Sets Records at Redford

C. W. Truxell, general manager of Detroit Diesel Engine Division of General Motors announced Monday that production and sales in the first half of 1965 established records for the division. 7395,304 horsepower were produced by Detroit Diesel—51.6 per cent more than in the corresponding period last year, which was the previous record.

Truxell pointed to an increase of over 56 per cent in sales of diesel engines to the trucking industry as a prime contributor to the new records. He also pointed out that Canadian shipments increased over 105 per cent; shipments for industrial applications were up approximately 40 per cent; and shipments to U.S. distributors were up over 40 per cent.

In the six month period, Detroit Diesel sold engines to over 400 equipment manufacturers for over 3,000 different types of power applications. It is this nearly universal acceptance by equipment manufacturers that has resulted in record-breaking production for Detroit Diesel.

Plant expansion continues at Detroit Diesel to keep up with production demands. In April, a new 200,000 square foot manufacturing area was put into operation. Later this year, a new engineering laboratory and a new addition to the administration building will be opened.

Ypsilanti Post Trooper Named "Man of Year"

Trooper Robert L. Johnston, 36, of the Ypsilanti post, has been chosen Michigan State Police "Trooper of the Year" for 1964 and is the third winner of the Gerstaecker award for outstanding community service or heroic action. Commissioner Frederick E. Davids announced. He was selected from five nominees by a three-man civilian committee.

Trooper Johnston was chosen because of his record of public service. The award was provided several years ago by Dr. and Mrs. Carl A. Gerstaecker of Midland. He is chairman of the board of the Dory Chemical Company. With the award goes \$500 to be used by the winner in three ways: For furthering his education through employment-related courses; as donations to charitable causes or worthy community projects; or left on deposit with the Michigan State Police Association for the welfare of departmental employees.

License Revenue Up \$3.25 Million

LANSING—If you were in business and that business showed a \$344-million increase in profits the first six operating months of the year without a substantial increase in cost, it would be considered quite successful.

That's where the Department of State finds itself with its vehicle licensing operation over the first half of 1965.

Total income from November 1, 1964, the start of the issuance of licenses, and May 31, 1965, was nearly \$73-million. Transactions kept pace with the increased revenue, showing a 176,000 rise.

Passenger cars led the upward swing, more than 140,000 over 1964 totals up to 3.3-million. Total vehicle licensing for 1965 edged toward the four-million total.

1,117,381 Titles Issued in 3 Months For Record

LANSING — The second quarter of 1965... April, May and June... proved to be the biggest three-month period in Michigan vehicle titling history. The record quarter shot the first-half of 1965 to a new high, 1,117,381, a six percent increase over last year at the same time.

All three months of the second quarter were above the 200,000-mark, with April a new all-time high month of 238,976. May kept pace with 235,887, and June proved the second largest month in history with 221,436 titles issued. The three-month figure was 695,400.
