Sylvia Lin To Solo This Week

Sylvia Lin, pianist, will be soloist with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra for Oakland University's Meadow Brook Music Festival concerts Thursday, Friday and Saturday, Aug. 5-7, at 8:30 p.m. in the Howard C. Baldwin Memorial Pavilion. Sixteen Erling will conduct.

The young Swedish-American artist born in the United States will be making her first appearance in this country in eight years with these performances. In Europe she has become one of the most sought after solo pianists on the concert stage.

Thursday and Friday nights Miss Lin will play the Schumann Concerto in A minor on a program which will include Rossini's Overture to "William Tell" and Rachmaninoff's Symphony No. 2 in E minor.

Saturday Miss Lin will play the Ravel Concerto in G major on a program which will include Weber's Overture to "Zurayana", Beethoven's Symphony No. 4 in B flat major and Lutoslawski's Concerto for Orchestra.

WSU's Bonstelle Theatre Announces '65-'66 Schedule

Wayne State University will present six English and Continental plays, including two musicals, on its 1965-66 Bonstelle Theatre subscription series.

The season, announced Saturday by Leonard Leone, director of the Wayne State University Theatre, includes "The Threepeny Opera" by Bertolt Brecht and Kurt Weill, "The Physicists" by Friedrich Durrenmat, "Lear" by John Osborne (originally scheduled for last season), a new translation of "When We Dead Awaken" by Henrik Ibsen, "The Comedy of Errors" by Shakespeare, and "Stop the World, I Want to Get Off" by Anthony Newley and Leslie Bricusse.

The season opens with "The Threepeny Opera" on Oct. 8, followed by "The Physicists" on Nov. 12, "Lear" on Jan. 28, "When We Dead Awaken" on March 4, "Comedy of Errors" on April 15, and "Stop the World" on May 13.

Each play runs for two weeks, Friday and Saturday the first week and Thursday through Sunday the second week. All performances are at 8:30 except the Sunday performance, which is a 2:30 matinee.

Season tickets go on sale September and individual tickets in October. Brochures with order blanks may be requested by calling 833-1400, extension 408.

"The Threepeny Opera," Brecht's greatest popular success, was written and first produced in Germany in 1928, and established his fame. It was first performed in America at the Empire Theatre in New York in 1933, and received a highly successful revival off-Broadway in 1954 and 1955.

A ballad opera with music by Kurt Weill, "The Threepeny Opera" is a free adaptation of John Gay's "Beggars Opera." It is set in a fantastic late nineteenth-century Bohemia and features ballads inspired by
