Vivian Sees Trouble for "Dropouts"

Announcing that the "drive against dropouts cannot be won by budget dollars alone," Congressman Weston E. Vivian (D), second district, addressed Eastern Michigan University's post-summer session, workshop on the dropout problem.

Rep. Vivian and State Representative Charles F. Gray (D) 52nd District, spoke at the opening session of the two-week program sponsored by EMU's college of education.

Rep. Vivian told the gathering of 30 educators that "the youngster who wants to work today is expected to show clear evidence that he has attained some level of sophistication in education."

The Congressman warned that failure to cope with the issue will saddle society with untold manpower that will cause a drain on the economy. He cautioned that dropouts will become a major concern in later years because of the rising technical demands of more occupations which call for increasingly specialized personnel.

He called for instructors to undertake "imaginative education" which would awaken the subject-matter interest of the student who is already considered apathetic.

Rep. Vivian concluded his address by listing a number of federal acts passed to provide educational training to students who had previously been deprived of opportunities to acquire job skills.

Farmington Schools To Have 4 Bookstores

Farmington Public Schools will operate four bookstores this year, opening Wednesday, Aug. 18 and continuing through Sept. 3.

Locations will be O. E. Dunkel Junior High, 32800 Twelve Mile Rd.; East Junior High, 25000 Middlebelt Rd.; the gym of Farmington Junior High and the Main Bookstore, Farmington Junior High, 33000 Thomas St.

Records of credit due students will be on file at all bookstores. Regular bookstore hours will be from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at all locations.

Extra hours have been established at all bookstores for Aug. 20 and Aug. 27 when the facilities will be open from 9 a.m. to 8 p.m. and on Aug. 21 and Aug. 28 when all bookstores will be open from 9 a.m. to noon.

Only the main bookstores will operate after Labor Day. Hours will be from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. This bookstore will offer extra hours Sept. 10 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. and Sept. 11 from 9 a.m. to noon.

Boy Scouts Begin Two-Year 'Breakthrough' Campaign

The challenge to reach boys wherever they may live—is being faced by the Boy Scouts of America in a two-year program called Breakthrough for Youth.

The membership of the Boy Scouts of America has reached a record high of 5,585,700. This was a 2.6% increase over the previous year, but there are still many boys without the opportunity to become Scouts. According to Rod Jenkins, president of the Detroit Area Boy Scout Council, the local council is currently serving over 50,000 boys and 21,401 leaders in Wayne County and the southern portions of Oakland and Macomb Counties.

"We must attain new levels of vision, determination, and immediacy," Jenkins said, "if we are to bring the values of Scouting to the boys who have not yet been reached."

Leaders who have watched Scouting grow over the last 55 years point out that the period in a boy's life for him to become prepared in mind, body, and spirit for adulthood is shorter or even before.

"We must use imagination in locating and motivating groups in special areas to sponsor the Scouting program and make it available where boys live," Jenkins added. Some of the answers, according to those who are determined to find the necessary breakthroughs, lie in finding unusual types of sponsoring organizations, recruiting
