

DISPLAYING WINES that will be used in the wine testing and gourmet dinner Friday night in the Mayflower Meeting House is Stanton Lorenz, assistant manager of the Mayflower Hotel and one of the progenitors of the idea of having wine tasting dinners. The French Consul, stationed in Detroit, will be one of the honored guests.

In Mayflower Meeting House Honor French Consul At Gourmet Party

More than 400 suburban gastronomes will gather for an evening of wine tasting and gourmet food savoring in Plymouth at the Mayflower Meeting House on Friday, October 22, at 8 o'clock as Ralph and Stalon Lorenz pay tribute to Monsieur Jean Le Brech, consul general of France.

Among the French vintages to be tasted and tested will be 1964 Julianas Beaujolais, a 1962 Focilly Fuisse white burgundy, 1961 Chateau Roumies Barzac Sauternes, a 1964 Beaujolais Blanc, 1961 Chateau Moncosseil L'alcour, a 1963 Travel Rose from the Rhone Valley, and New York State champagne and "cold duck." The 1964 selections will be available exclusively through the wine shop.

Wine connoisseurs and experts will be on hand to call attention to such nuances of the changes as its bouquet, color, body, aroma, dryness, acidity, and other qualities.

"France has 1,400,000 wine growers," Stalon Lorenz points out, "and, with the help of such wine knowledgeable masters as Alexis Lichine, we have tried to bring the finest vintages from all areas of France to our guests this Friday."

Many of the wines have come to the Port of Detroit via the sea-way and according to Ralph Lorenz, "have rested in the cool Mayflower cellars just long enough to quiet them down."

Decorating and preparing the extensive hors'oeuvre, chaud and froid buffet table will be ice carvings created by the Round Table Club Chef de Cuisine William Wright who is also in charge of decorating in the French tradition, the trout, salmon, ham, turkeys, lobsters, king crabs, Spanish shrimp, and other gastronomical delights for both eye and palate.

Among the cold canapes will be eggs, tartar sandwiches, caviar, anchovies, and items heretofore experienced only by the well-traveled.

Oysters Casino, crabmeat Lorenzo, breast of watermelon and cheese puff, and other creations will be found among the hot canapes.

The hors'oeuvres table will be filled with clams, baby Japanese shrimp, stuffed celery, marinated mushrooms, crab fingers, and other imported domestic delicacies. Invitations for the affair have been issued to suburban civic and cultural leaders, and to members of local gourmet classes.

Leo Nye, Longtime Judge, Dies

Judge Leo Nye, 74, longtime political leader in Livonia who served the community for more than 25 years as Justice of Peace and Municipal Judge, died early Tuesday morning in Ridgewood Hospital. He had been ailing since the death of his wife, Mae, in 1963.

Judge Nye, a veteran of World War I, had been active in Livonia politics until he became ill. He had resided at 29635 Florence in Garden City for the past year. He was born in Holland, Mich., and had spent all of his life in the Detroit area.

The body was taken to the Caldwell Funeral Home, 29611 Ford Road, in Garden City where services will be conducted Thursday afternoon at 1 p.m. in charge of Rev. James Allen. Judge Nye is survived by five nieces.
