"Murder in the Cathedral" is the play chosen by the Dun Scotus Players, 2000 W. Nine Mile, Southfield, for presentation in the College auditorium on Oct. 31, Nov. 5 and 7. Curtain time is 8 p.m.

The play is by the late modern poet T. S. Eliot, written in morality fashion for presentation in the cathedral of Canterbury in 1323. The story deals with the martyrdom of Thomas A. Becket in the twelfth century, but Eliot subtly includes numerous points pertinent to audiences of the modern day.

This will be the second time the DSC Players—fearless semi-amateurs—are presenting "Murder." The first was in 1959. This year, however, they have come up with a completely new production.

The play is under the direction of Rev. Leander Blumlein, O.F.M., instructor of English and president of the college.

## Concert Programs Announced

The Paul Taylor Dance Company, a modern dance group of international acclaim, will open the tenth anniversary season of the Founders Society Detroit Institute of Arts Concert Series on Oct. 22.

Edith J. Freeman, chairman of the series since its origin, has announced a season of distinguished and varied performances: on Nov. 5 Sergei Obraztsov, master puppeteer, will appear in a program of songs, stories and demonstrations; Dec. 13 brings Vladimir Ashkenazy, Russian pianist, who made his U.S. debut in 1958; Jan. 14 the Juilliard String Quartet; Feb. 11—Nicanor Zabaleta, harpist; May 17—Solisti Veneti, 12-member string ensemble directed by Claudio Scimone, making his first American tour.

Season tickets for this regular Concert Series are available now at the Detroit Institute of Arts ticket office (ground floor of museum), all J. L. Hudson ticket service offices and Grinnell's downtown. Individual tickets will be available after Oct. 4.

In addition to the regular concert series, a special concert will be presented on Feb. 1 featuring the Krakow Choir and Orchestra. This event commemorates the Polish Millennium (1968-1966) and is arranged in cooperation with Detroit's Polish Millennium Committee.

The month of December will bring two extra concerts of unusual interest, according to Mrs. Freeman. On Dec. 4 the Christmas season will be heralded by the Krakow Consort of Voices, Viols and other historic instruments from the University of Michigan, presenting a medieval music-drama, "The Son of Getron," and a program of carols of the period. Performers will appear in medieval costume, and play instruments of the period.

On Dec. 17, to complement The Detroit Institute of Arts distinguished exhibition of "Art Treasures from Japan" and "Contemporary Japanese Art" (Dec. 8-Jan. 16), Dr. William Main will present a program of Japanese music performed on authentic instruments. Dr. Main is associate professor of the School of Music at the University of Michigan.
