Over 200 parents were welcomed at the first meeting and annual "Open House" of the 1966-67 Shear P.T.A. program Monday evening, Oct. 11.

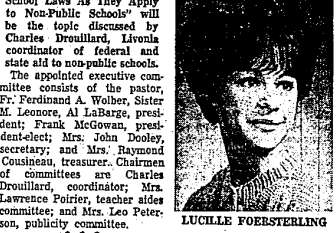
Classroom visitations and an explanation of the curriculum were the main features of the program.

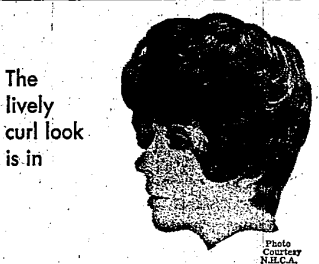
Mrs. Virginia Kearns' first grade class won the parent attendance award and Richard Morse's fourth grade class was runner-up.
