Sixteen Ehrling, a distinguished pianist as well as conductor, will join violinist Gordon Staples in a special recital Sun., Nov. 7, at 3:30 p.m. in the Gold Room at Oakland University.

The program will include the Brahms Sonata No. 3 in D minor, the Debussy Sonata No. 1 in G minor and the Beethoven Sonata No. 9 in A major ("Kreutzer").

This will be Ehrling's first appearance in the area since returning from a highly successful tour of the east with the Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

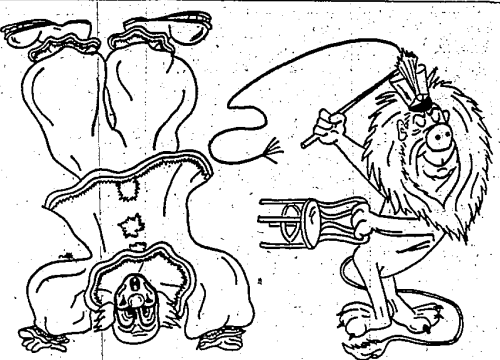

Original Comedy Is First Production

"Get Yourself a College Boy," an original play by Farmington High School, Alumnus, Kingsley Cotton, will be presented "in-the-round" at Farmington High School on Friday and Saturday evening, Nov. 12 and 13.

The student work is presented and directed by Lee S. MacLeish, best known for his Pulitzer Prize play, "J. B." The University of Michigan Professional Theatre Program has been fortunate enough to be the first group in the world to do this new play.

"Heracles," as staged by Alan Schneider, poetically depicts man's struggle to be a God unto himself.

In "J. B." MacLeish explored man's relationship to God. In "Heracles" he probes the ancient Greek myth in which Heracles, a new play by him, and murders his sons, completing the labors, Heracles returns to the priestess of Apollo at Delphi. The play reveals the chance to live like a god. His reward is tainted however with the violent act of murdering his own sons.

Archibald MacLeish, at 73 years of age is too sedate and calm an individual to join the student demonstrators as they picket their draft boards. He is mounting a monster-like action in Viet Nam. MacLeish uses the stage as his platform to denounce all the senseless killing now going on in the world.

The APA Repertory company has mounted the production in splendid fashion. Kenzie Curtis, Dee Victor, Jennifer Harmon, Sidney Walker, Betty Miller, Patricia Conolly, and Rosemary Harris bring a new sense of meaning out of MacLeish's brilliant couplets. The inner clash of ideas, ancient and modern, come sharply into focus under the experienced directorial guidance of Alan Schneider.
