

WERB Faces U.S. Suit Over Wages

An injunction suit against WERB, Inc., and the Garden City Broadcasting Co., 32500 Park Lane, Garden City, was filed in the U.S. District Court in Cleveland by Secretary of Labor W. Willard Wirtz, under the Fair Labor Standards Act.

Milton Maltz and Robert Wright, individually and as officers of the two corporations, were also cited in the injunctive action.

The complaint alleges that the defendants failed to pay many employees the required overtime pay since October 10, 1963, and also failed to maintain adequate and accurate records of hours worked and wages paid employees.

A judgment is being sought to permanently enjoin and restrain the defendants from future violations of the law, including the restraint of any withholding of payment of overtime compensation found by the Court to be due employees.

Legal action followed an investigation of the station by the Detroit West office of the U.S. Labor Department's Wage-Hour and Public Contracts Division, under the supervision of Frank C. Modelt.

The corporations are engaged in radio broadcasting and related news gathering and dissemination activities for interstate and foreign commerce.

Modelt noted that the Federal minimum wage for all employees now covered by the law is \$1.25 an hour. The Fair Labor Standards Act also requires the payment of time and one-half pay rate for overtime work.
