**Pistons Sponsor
Platoon for
Marine Corps**

The Detroit Pistons announced Monday that they are sponsoring a "Detroit Pistons Platoon" of U. S. Marines.

The platoon will be limited to 75 qualified young men from Michigan and the Toledo, O. area. They will leave for recruit training at the Marine Corps Recruit Depot, San Diego, Calif., on Jan. 21, 1964.

Prior to leaving for San Diego, the unit will be the guests of the Pistons for the game with the St. Louis Hawks that evening at Cobo Hall. During halftime they will be introduced to the spectators at the game.

Plans are also being made by Pistons' officials for a "Meet the Pistons Day" for interested applicants on a date to be announced. The neophyte leathernecks will be guests of the Pistons at the Philadelphia Warriors game on Dec. 29.

Interested and qualified applicants may enlist in the Marine Corps at any time during the next seven weeks to become a member of the "Detroit Pistons Platoon" through the Corps' 120-day delay program.

Two, three and four year enlistments are presently available to qualified applicants between the ages of 17 and 27.

Young men interested in becoming a member of the "Detroit Pistons Platoon" should contact their local Marine Corps recruiter for further information.

Forests of America are growing nearly 60 percent more wood than is being removed by harvesting and natural causes. That's the latest word from a survey by the U.S. Forest Service.

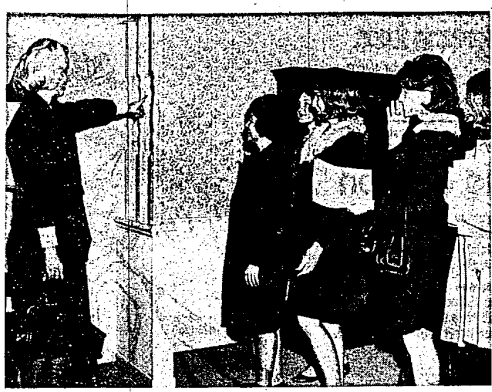

**Warns of Constant Danger
Of Carbon Monoxide Gas**

LANSING—"You don't have to shut yourself up in a garage with a running car to be in danger of being killed by carbon monoxide gas. This invisible agent can attack you in your home, out-of-doors in a parked car, or in a cabin in the woods.

Albert E. Heustis, state health director, today issued a warning against the dangers of this lethal gas.

"This time of year always brings an alarming increase in accidental carbon monoxide poisonings. This is a totally unnecessary toll that could be eliminated if people would follow a few basic preventive steps. Carbon monoxide is a killer than can be controlled," he observed.

Although automobiles are not the only source of the poisonous gas, they are the main one.

A defective automobile exhaust system is a likely source of poisoning from this colorless, tasteless, and odorless killer. The car is a potential coffin if fumes seep back through the fire wall or up through the floor, according to Dr. Heustis. This can happen even if the car is out-of-doors and moving. If it is parked, the situation is worse.

You should check your complete exhaust system at least once a year at a service station, and keep it in good repair at all times.

Another danger, Dr. Heustis

pointed out, is called "exhaust feedback." This can occur even though the vehicle's exhaust system is in good condition.

Carbon monoxide fumes can drift back over the passengers after the gas is expelled through the tailpipe and completely envelop the automobile. Obstructions, such as a snowbank or building, may make the situation fatal by deflecting more fumes over the vehicle.

Dr. Heustis warned motorists not to run the engine in idled cars under any circumstances, and to keep at least one window cracked open when driving.

In the home, charcoal grills present a serious hazard. A burning charcoal fire produces no smoke, but gives off great quantities of invisible carbon monoxide gas. The grills are for outside cooking only and should never be used indoors or even in a garage or on a partially enclosed breezeway, he said.

Other dangers include furnaces with rusted out flues and other defects. Carbon monoxide poisoning can also result from poorly vented or adjusted space heaters, hot water heaters, and maladjusted gas refrigerators.

Cabins are especially likely places for trouble because of old appliances and poor venting. Proper venting must be through the roof, not a side wall.

**Thief Learns
Lifted Birches
Are Aspens**

There's an Upper Peninsula landowner who has four carefully replanted trees on his property, thanks to the stern eye of Norman Remington, Escanaba, plant specialist with the Michigan Department of Agriculture.

The stolen trees were being illegally hauled home in the trunk of a car stopped by Remington for routine inspection. The over-eager driver said he had lifted the four "little birches" where he'd found them in the woods. Remington reminded him of the violations involved: Trees stolen from private property. No insect and disease inspection. No nursery license.

Rather than press charges, Remington convinced the man of the error of his ways. It was suggested that he replant them in the freshly dug holes under Remington's supervision. The ill-informed birch-lover was eager to comply. Especially, noted Remington, when he found that his "little birches" weren't birches at all, but aspens.

Remington, a trained forester, works with the Michigan Department of Agriculture's plant industry division. Such tree checks are mainly to insure that plant diseases are not spread. However, as in this case, outright stealing is often prevented.
