Plans for Highway Expansion in Future

The extension of the North-western Highway expressway while "something that should be done" is not planned for the immediate future according to officials for the State Highway Department.

Following a meeting of the Farmington Township Planning Commission Nov. 29 where such a proposed extension was discussed, The Observer contacted highway department officials in both Pontiac and Detroit.

Both said that they knew of nothing in the immediate future plans for the extension of Northwestern expressway, to hook up with M59 near Pontiac.

One spokesman pointed out that this had been proposed in 1957, but added that the area had changed so much in the interim that "new plans would have to be drawn before anything could be done now."

All agreed, however, that the extension of the expressway was necessary for a transportation network for the entire Metropolitan area.

F'ton Council Abandons Water Main

The Farmington City Council Monday night voted to abandon the section of the water main servicing the Longview School but only after they were assured that this would not complicate matters "in the event of any future attempts at annexation in the area."

In answer to the question from Councilman John Allen, City Manager John Dinean said that if an annexation took place the main would be a part of the assets of the Township for which the City would pay.

The City has been supplying water to the Longview School since 1958 through a main which the Schools built at that time.

"Now, however, the Township has offered to purchase this main and the Oakland County Department of Public Works would hook it up with the main on Grand River to service the school."

The Council approved the action contingent on the receipt of a written request from the Schools.
