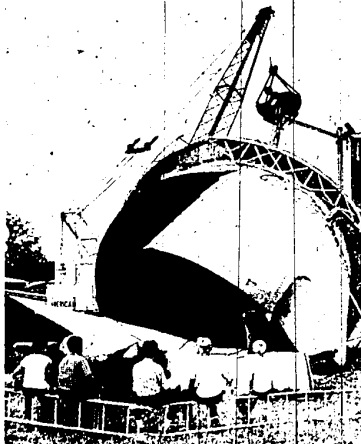

DEMOLITION OF THE WATER storage tank at Shilavasee and Ontario in Forest Park Subdivision drew a crowd of young "sidewalk superintendents" last week. The 114,000 gallon tank which had an over-all height of 135 feet outlived its usefulness since the homes in the area are now getting Detroit water. The Oakland County Department of Public Works has maintained the structure and handled arrangements for its demolition. The tank was purchased by builders from the Michigan Stone Company which had used it as a reserve or stand-by water supply for fire protection.

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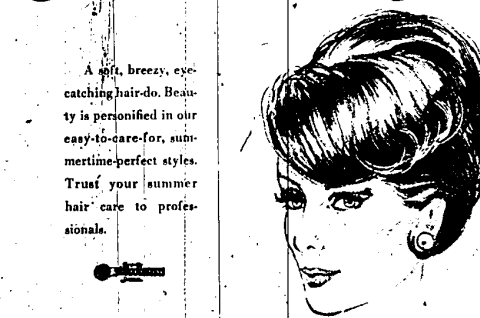

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
