Record Registration in Summer Rec. Program

A total of 1111 young boys and girls of the Farmington area have thus far registered in the summer recreation program. This exceeds the amount registered last year at this time.

Last Friday saw 270 of our South Section youth attend our second trip of the year to the zoo. This figure, when added to the number that made the journey the week before from the North Section, totals 585 youngsters.

Rain hampered swim activities the previous Wednesday. A short swim was followed by a visit to the Nature Cabin in the woods of Kensington Park. ALTOGETHER, the Commission has played host to 1058 youngsters who have taken part in the first two weeks of swimming activities. This same period saw 1989 boys and girls attend craft and recreational activities at the various playground sites. These figures added to the numbers that made the trek to the zoo make a grand total of 3630 participants.

There will be no program activities for the North Section this Friday. A visit with the Tigers is planned instead the following day, Saturday, July 17. Admittance to the ballpark is free and buses will be loaded on a first-come, first-serve basis.

IN PAST YEARS, the Commission has been fortunate in not having to leave anyone behind. It is hoped that this year will not prove differently. Those interested in going to the game should be at their playground site at 10:15 a.m. Buses will leave at 10:45 a.m. and should arrive back approximately one hour and fifteen minutes after the game has ended. The bringing of a large-size lunch is suggested as past years have proven the day to be somewhat long.
