Head Start Program Has 16 Enrolled This Year

The Clarenceville School District's "Head Start Program" is well under way with several staff members and area residents working toward its success. With the opening of the classroom door on July 6 and the raising of the Head Start flag at Edgewood School, 16 youngsters started their formal educational training.

However, this summer program is not an exact kindergarten program. The curriculum designed by Clarenceville staff members includes many of the regular kindergarten activities. Mrs. Norma Kitzman, Head Start teacher, is working with art materials, organized games, body coordina-

tion, speaking and listening activities, and social activities. Each of these activities is designed to help the young child to make the adjustment from his preschool ways to the ways of school life.

Along with the developing of the student, this program helps create a new interest in education within the parents of these children. The parents take an active part in the classroom activities as well as the field trips and other social activities. Each morning at 9:00 the program starts with a breakfast served at the school.

PARENTS are asked to help serve this meal. After breakfast, the importance of care of the teeth is emphasized, by supervised brushing. The introduction of dental care was done by Dr. Sam Prisk who volunteered his services and a supply of tooth brushes and paste.

Perhaps one of the most important features of this program is the fact that due to the small number of children in the class, the teaching can be done almost on an individual basis which will offer these children the proper start to school once the regular semester begins in September.

THIS PROGRAM is a part of the nation wide Head Start Project and the expense of the program is on a shared basis. This year the federal government is assuming 90% of the total cost of the Clarenceville program. The additional 10% amounting to about \$300, is being paid by the school district. This total program is another example of the Clarenceville School District offering to the children of the district the quality education, the parents have requested.

35 Foreign Pupils Here

The Clarenceville School District was honored to have 35 A.F.S. students visit the district for three days in early July.

The bus load of students who had spent this past school year in several different high schools throughout Minnesota arrived at the Clarenceville High School where the students met their adult sponsors. These sponsors provided the students with a home, meals, and entertainment for three days.

During the three days some organized group activities were planned such as a swim party at the Botsford Inn pool and a tour of the Ford Rouge Plant.

Following their visit here the students moved on to New York and Washington, D. C., where they joined with about 3000 other A.F.S. students from all parts of the United States to meet with President Johnson. Following that meeting it was back to New York and the voyage home after a year's stay in the United States.

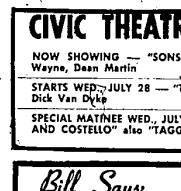
