

F. Warner State Governor 3 Terms

One of Farmington's most prominent and noted citizens in its long history was Fred M. Warner.

His success in state politics in the early 1900's really "put Farmington on the map."

It was in 1900 that Fred Warner was nominated as a Republican candidate for the office of Michigan Secretary of State and was elected later in that same year to go on to serve for two terms.

At the GOP State Convention in Detroit on June 30, 1904, Warner was nominated unanimously as the party's candidate for governor and was elected to this highest state office on Nov. 8 of that same year.

WARNER served the state well in his first two-year term and was re-elected again in 1906 and 1908 to become the first governor of Michigan to serve for three consecutive terms.

Another distinction which was his was that he was the youngest secretary of state to have ever been elected and also the state's youngest governor to have ever served from the time of the adoption of the state constitution in 1850.

Born in Nottinghamshire, England in 1865, Warner's parents moved to this country when he was only three months old. A few months later his mother died and young Fred was adopted by Judge P. D. Warner who was active in politics at that time himself.

A bright boy, Fred Warner graduated from Farmington High at the age of 14 and then attended the state agricultural college for one year after which he became a clerk in his father's store here.

A FEW YEARS later this mercantile business was turned over to him to operate and Fred conducted the business successfully for the next several years.

In 1889, shortly after The Enterprise had begun publishing, Fred Warner helped provide many jobs for the community by establishing a large cheese factory here. Its success led to the establishment of similar factories elsewhere in Oakland County and other communities in the state.

WARNER helped found and was president of the Farmington State Savings Bank. He was also vice president of the Detroit United Bank and had an interest in a number of other banks and financial institutions in Eastern Michigan.

Warner first entered state politics in 1895 when he was elected to the state senate. He served two terms as the youngest senator in the state.

Fred Warner died in Orlando, Florida on April 17, 1923. He had gone there the previous fall for his health. His body was returned to Farmington where he was laid to rest in Oakwood Cemetery.

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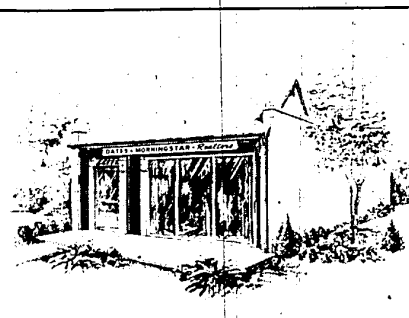
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
