

FARC Summer Program To End with Bob-Lo Trip

This coming Friday, August 6, will mark the conclusion of the Farmington Area Recreation Commission's program. A trip to Bob-Lo Island is planned for this occasion. Buses will load at the respective playground sites from 9 to 9:20 a.m. Tickets can be purchased from counselors at the playgrounds. The fee is 75 cents for those 8 to 11 years of age and \$1.50 for those 12 to 15 years of age. This does not cover the expense of entertainment on the island. Buses should arrive back at about 6:30 p.m.

The FARC held its annual Field Day this past Friday at City Park. Playground sites that participated in the day's events included eight from the Farmington area and two from Clarencville.

A TOTAL OF 247 young boys and girls competed in various planned contests. The morning was spent in competition on an individual basis. Prizes were awarded to first, second, and third place winners in each of the scheduled events which were broken down into four age groups.

The afternoon was utilized by the playing of baseball games in a tournament that saw the Beechview playfield come out victoriously. They defeated Clarencville's Edgewood playground 5 to 4 to carry home group prizes.

The response of the merchants in both the Farmington and Clarencville areas to the Commission's request for donations was indeed gratifying. The prizes awarded to winners of events did much to help make the day a more pleasant one for the children to enjoy.

THE DIRECTOR of the program, Evelyn Bager, reported that he was happily surprised at the gracious and genuine interest shown by merchants who wished to help make the Field Day an enjoyable one for the youngsters. Several

Local Couple Celebrates 60th Wedding Anniversary

Mr. and Mrs. William F. Lancaster, 33104 Grand River in Farmington, celebrated their sixtieth wedding anniversary on August 1, at the lodge of Mr. and Mrs. Richard Lancaster on Saginaw Bay near Sebewaing.



William Francis Lancaster and Margaret Slifer were married August 1, 1905, in the latter's Expression Studio at Alton, Illinois. Both were born and reared at Bunker Hill, Illinois, just 20 miles east of Alton.

Mr. Lancaster's grandfather, Francis Lancaster of London, England, came to Bunker Hill in 1844. He bought 800 acres of farm land, made the brick and built a 13-room farm house and a large barn. Both buildings are still standing and are in good repair.

His son, Joseph, fell heir to this homestead and it was there that William was born.

THAT SAME year, 1844, David Slifer of Dayton, Ohio, came to Illinois and bought land about five miles from the Lancaster's. At his death, his son William inherited the Slifer farm and it was there that Margaret was born. The young folks attended the Bunker Hill Military Academy, where day students were accepted as well as the cadets. It was at the academy that they first met and seven years later they were married.

They had a son, Richard M. Lancaster, 33353 West Nine Mile Road in Farmington. They visited him several times and he became somewhat acquainted with Farmington and decided when they retired they might like to locate here. They subscribed to the Farmington Enterprise and read and studied about the community for a year before moving here. In July, 1944, they bought their present home on Grand River.

MR. LANCASTER drove a local school bus for eleven years and Mrs. Lancaster has taught Expression all her life.

Mr. Lancaster will be 87 in September, and his wife was 84 last April.
