Announces Plans to Organize A Symphony Orchestra Here

Otto Kurt Schmeisser will organize a symphony orchestra in Farmington. Mr. Schmeisser has a unique musical background in Europe and also in this country. He studied at the Royal Conservatory of Leipzig and also studied harmony and composition with Felix von Woysech and Wilhelm Koehler. He was a

trumpet soloist with such great European orchestras as the Gewandhaus Orchestra in Leipzig and the Hamburg Philharmonic Orchestra. He also performed in many other European countries and was highly regarded as a trumpet virtuoso. WHILE IN EUROPE, Mr. Schmeisser performed under such conductors as Arthur Nikisch, Bruno Walter, Otto Klemperer, Wilhelm Furtwangler, Siegfried Wagner (the son of Richard Wagner), and Richard Strauss. In this country, he has performed under Serge Koussevitzky, Pierre Monteux, Boston Symphony Orchestra, and Ossip Gabrilowitch, Detroit Symphony Orchestra.

YWCA Camper Climax Season

The YWCA's Camp Cavell on Lake Huron, near Lexington, Michigan, closes its 1965 resident camp Friday, August 20, having accommodated 600 campers between the ages of 8 and 18 during the four two-week sessions, according to Mrs. Frances Cusick, camp director.

YWCA groups and other organizations have rented the camp for the remainder of August and during September and October, she said. FIRST TO ARRIVE will be the State Y-Teen Conference, scheduled for August 22-27 with an expected attendance of 125 Y-Teens from YWCAs throughout Michigan. This conference will be followed by a round-up of members of the American Latvian Youth Association, August 28-September 5. Some 100 members of the Association will come from all parts of the United States for the round-up, Mrs. Cusick said.



MR. SCHMEISSER is also well known as a teacher, having taught at the Boston Conservatory of Music and Wayne State University as well as giving private instruction. Many of his students have gone on to become symphony orchestra members and teachers.

For several years, Mr. Schmeisser conducted park concerts for the City of Detroit. In the 1930's, he organized and conducted the W.P.A. and N.Y.A. Symphonies.

MR. ROBERT Zimmermann, music conductor and teacher at Farmington High School will also conduct the new symphony orchestra. Applications for positions will be accepted from musicians who are at least sixteen years of age. Auditions will be held at a later date.

Public School Nurse is Named

Mrs. Dona Cavenee, nursing supervisor, Oakland County Public Health Department, will work with the Farmington Public Schools during the 1965-66 school year.

Mrs. Cavenee replaces Miss Helen Clark who is taking an educational leave of absence to complete her master's degree in public health nursing at the University of Michigan.

Mrs. Cavenee has been on the Oakland County Public Health Department staff for seven years. Her previous assignment was with communities in the north part of the county.
