Branch of Nursing Which Has to Do With Care of Infants Now a Profession.

The branch of nursing which has to do with the care of little children

to do with the care of little children was inaugurated as a profession in England about twenty years ago, the Norland institute in London having the honor of being the pioneer training school of the kind.

The Nursery college curriculum includes, besides nursery management, domestic work, hygiene and needlework. Of the one year required to complete the training at the Norland institute, thriteen weeks are spent in one of the London children's hospitals, three months in practical nursing, and the remaining time at institutional work.
