

Auxiliary Police Training Course to Open Sept. 1

The Farmington City Department of Public Safety will offer an 11-week Auxiliary Police Training Course beginning Wednesday evening, September 1, at 7:30 p.m. in the Farmington Municipal Court, 23600 Liberty Street in Farmington.

Sgt. Richard H. Miller, Program Director, urges all men 21 years of age and over to take advantage of the free course which will meet for two-hour sessions on successive Wednesday nights, Sept. 1 through November 10. Upon successful completion of the course, men will be eligible to join the Farmington City Auxiliary Police Force, however, it was emphasized by Sgt. Miller, persons need not feel obligated in any way to become auxiliary officers.

THE COURSE WILL cover several areas such as first aid and fire prevention which should prove invaluable to men interested in keeping abreast of the latest developments and techniques in these important fields.

Chief Maurice D. Folz, Director of the Farmington City Department of Public Safety, will be the instructor for the five sessions of the course devoted to first aid. Chief Folz is also the first aid instructor for the Michigan Police Academy and is a highly qualified instructor.

OTHER PHASES OF the course will be instructed by Sgt. Miller, Detective William Garden, Officer Glenn T.

Harding, Jr. and Sgt. Jay Harrison, all of the Farmington Department of Public Safety.

In order to be eligible to join the Farmington City Auxiliary Police Force, an applicant must be at least 21 years of age, in good physical health, at least 5'7" in height, must have a good driving record and have good personal habits. Candidates must also be able to accept responsibility of the position of an auxiliary public safety officer and capable of performing police and fire duties.
