Have 2 New Teachers at St. Paul's

St. Paul's Lutheran Church of Farmington announced the installation of two new teachers in their day school.

Mr. David Wyant will teach grades five and six and also act as youth director. Wyant, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Julius A. Wyant, was born October 14, 1941, at Rogers City, Michigan. A product of St. John's Lutheran Elementary School, he attended the public high school and graduated from Concordia Teachers' College, River Forest, Illinois, in June of 1965.

The Wyans reside at 20730 Robinson Saget, Farmington, Michigan. Mrs. Tom Hay, who will teach grades one and two, grew up in a teacherage in Mount Clemens, Michigan, as Donna Des Rasse. Her father is principal of Trinity Lutheran School there. All of her elementary years were spent at that same Trinity. At Mount Clemens High, Donna decided that teaching was to be her vocation, so she entered Concordia Teachers College, Seward, Nebraska (the Alma Mater of several Rasses before her) in September of 1961.

AFTER EARNING a double major in Mathematics and Religion, and holding down jobs as a waitress in a Seward Cafe, a secretary to the religion department head, the grader for several math and religion professors, and a house counselor at Ruth Hall, Donna graduated with the Bachelor's Degree in June, 1965. Her teaching days were spent at Mount Olive Congregation in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, where she taught the fifth grade and kindergarten for eight weeks.

Wedding bells rang on August 28, when Donna became the wife of Thomas Charles Hay also of Mount Clemens. Tom is presently employed at Pontiac Motors and will return to school second semester at Eastern in Ypsilanti where he will finish work for a degree. Mr. and Mrs. Tom Hay presently reside at 20730 Robinson.

The Trojans had over 50 grid candidates turn out for opening day drills. The gridgers have been working out in three split sessions, broken down for backs and linemen in separate morning workouts and an afternoon practice with the entire squad.

Free instruction and Nursery services are open to all women of the area whether or not they are PTA members. For further information, call Shirlee Korte (478-3436).

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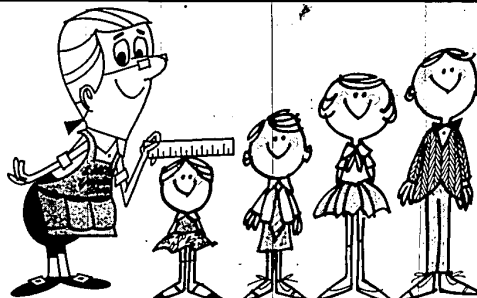
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
