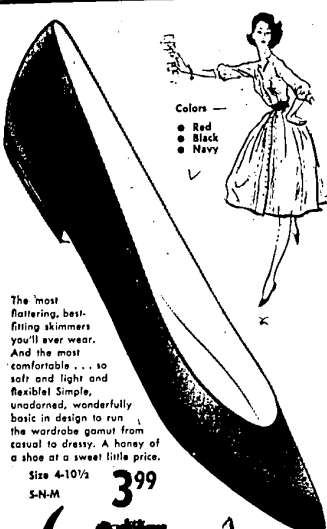

### To Offer Spanish at Longacre
