Jaycee Auxiliary Launches Physical Fitness Project

The Theme for the Michigan Junior Chamber of Commerce Auxiliary Board Meeting held in Jackson October 16 was "Physical Fitness".

The Physical Fitness endeavor is a new project that the Michigan Jaycee Auxiliary President, Jeanne Bequais of St. Clair Shores, initiated at the beginning of her year of office. This State Chairmanship was accepted by Mrs. John Richardson last May, and since, the Fitness project had been in the organizational stages. Working with Mrs. Richardson has been Mrs. James Alstrom, Co-Chairman.

THE LUNCHEON speaker was Fred Gelsler, Associate Executive, State Y.M.C.A. of Lansing, who helped kick-off this statewide Physical Fitness program. Following the luncheon at the Hotel Hayes in Jackson, the Michigan Jaycee Auxiliary held a Physical Fitness Clinic for the 300 members attending the board meeting.

The "physical activity" part of the Clinic was lead by Jane Marshall, Physical Instructor from the Northeastern Y.M.C.A. Detroit. This past June, Mrs. Marshall had completed the Bonnie Prudden Teacher's Training Institute at Stockbridge, Mass.

During the remaining part of the Clinic, Mrs. Richardson and Mrs. Alstrom informed the members about the over-all Physical Fitness Program and how they could initiate the program in their own local auxiliary thus bringing Physical Fitness to over 2300 ladies in Michigan between 21 and 35 years of age.

The State Chairman and Co-Chairman have also printed a book called "Fun and Fitness". The book contains the concept and definition of Physical Fitness; seven steps to complete fitness which includes proper medical and dental care, nutrition, rest and relaxation, home hygiene, and exercise.
