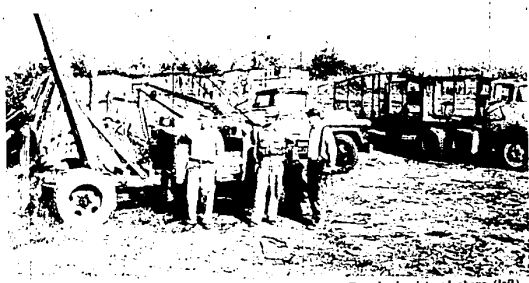

THE JUNK YARD FENCE around the old Betsky Brothers property at Ten Mile Road and Grand River Avenue in Farmington Township is on its way down after more than 30 years as an eye sore for motorists. Sex Education Courses Slated

The series will also be offered at East Jr. High and Dunkel Jr. High during this school year.

K of C To Show Movie On Cuba

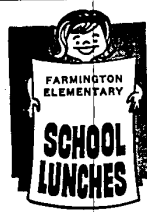
At a regular meeting on Wednesday, November 3, St. Francis Council, Knights of Columbus, will present "Castro's Take Over of Cuba."
