twenty-five children in the Farmington Public Schools. These children are physically and/or mentally handicapped and range in age from five to sixteen years. Annually money is raised by the club to support this very worthwhile work.

This year, under the joint chairmanship of Mrs. Vernon Vickland and Mrs. Thomas Simmons, the Hill and Dale Garden Club presents Zella Wyatt Schulke, nationally known flower arranger and judge, lecturer and author, in "Create for Christmas," a lecture and demonstration.

The program is being presented November 19 at 1 p.m. at the Franklin Community Church, in the Village of Franklin, and is open to the public with a donation of \$1.75. To Get Free Chalk Boards

Farmington School Board members, at a regular meeting on October 25, accepted an offer of the Peninsular Slate Co. to replace all chalk boards in the original rooms built at Dunckel Junior High School at no cost to the school district.

The school was originally equipped with natural slate boards, but Peninsular Slate will install Lucite, a synthetic board, provided an objective study and comparison of these boards to slate is made. Peninsular Slate Co. sells both materials, but contends that slate is becoming scarce and inferior in quality.

The chalk boards at Dunckel Junior High have not been satisfactory and board members were pleased with the offer. Supt. Harrison said that most of the credit for the replacement belongs to Herbert Seal who has investigated various chalk boards and has contacted the state company several times.

This will be guest night and all citizens of Farmington are invited to attend and hear this informative talk. Refreshments will be served.

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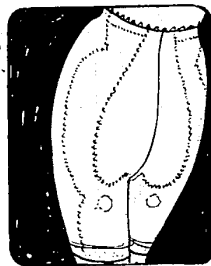
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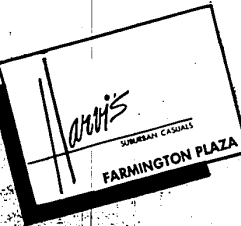
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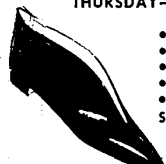
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
