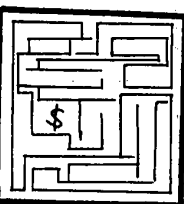
Mrs. Kenneth P. Wallace is the Transportation Chairman of the Club, succeeding Mrs. John Slagle who has moved from the area.
