

Twp. Board Okays Middlebelt Rezoning

Re-zoning of a parcel of land on the east side of Middlebelt Road at Nine Mile and abutting the Flamingo Trailer Park from R-4 (residential) to B-3 (general commercial) was officially approved by the Township Board at its regular meeting Monday night, Nov. 22.

All Board members were in agreement that this was the best possible use for this parcel. The Township Planning Commission voted unanimously in favor of recommending the requested zoning change for approval to the Township Board.

Announce Second Term Classes In Clarenceville Adult Ed.

Looking back over the years and comparing today with the past, the people of Clarenceville School District are becoming more and more involved in their adult education program. Mr. James Leary, Adult Education Director, is busy scheduling the second term programs to start on January 17; and he is finding it somewhat difficult to put all of the people in the classes they want at the time they want. However, this along with several other problems have been worked out in the past and the second term courses will offer the greatest number of subjects and classes ever offered at Clarenceville High School.

Such very popular classes as Knitting, Sewing, Lapidary, and Typing will be expanded to include those students just starting as well as the advanced students needing review or of specialized help with a problem. Special classes are sometimes added to meet the demands of the people. An example of this was the addition of a special holiday class for decorations and table settings.

SINCE THE FIRST class meeting only two weeks ago, the enrollment has doubled; and plans now include the continuation of the class so flower arrangements and horticulture can be added to the study. Mrs. Cartee, instructor of the class, is a well known resident of this area and is very happy with the current interest in the class.

Another different class being presented at this time is the Police Procedures and Administration course which is taught by Farmington Police Chief, Mr. Maurice Polt. Thirty men from the security forces of the Northland and Westland Shopping Centers attend this class during their off duty hours. In addition to working as security police, many of these men are deputized by their county sheriff patrol and are keenly interested in police procedures. While the class started out as

a special eight week course, plans are now under way for a continuation of this study.

The opening of the gym and swimming pool allowed for the addition of recreational and swimming classes. Driver Education classes are a going class and enrollments are always welcome. A large demand for a special class in the Income Tax Program has prompted Clarenceville to add such a class to the next term offerings.

Information about second term enrollment will be sent to area residents within a few weeks and classes will start shortly after the first of the year. Persons interested in enrolling in classes should watch for the notice or call Mr. Leary at 476-4626 after 1:30 p.m.
