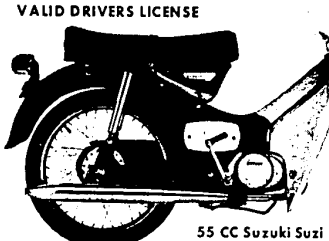

## YMCA Gym, Swim Classes Scheduled

YMCA gym and swim classes will begin a new series on Saturday, December 11, at the Redford High School on Grand River at Six Mile. Classes run for eight weeks and the emphasis is on physical fitness development through a gym and swim program.

The Gym Classes include games and sports which are not highly competitive but provide boys and girls an opportunity to learn new skills while having fun.

The Swim Classes are based on the National YMCA Progressive Swim Program.
