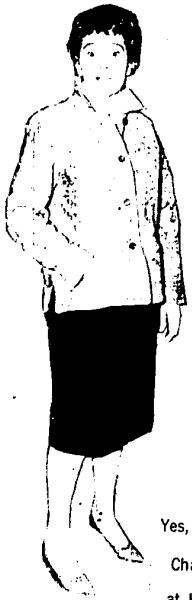

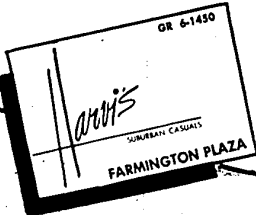

Dave Randolph Carrier Pilot On Lexington

Naval Aviation Cadet David R. Randolph, son of Mr. and Mrs. James G. Randolph of 24065 Middlebelt, Farmington, recently qualified for carrier landings aboard the aircraft carrier USS Lexington, operating in the Gulf of Mexico, while undergoing flight training at Pensacola, Fla.

In order to qualify, he had to make six successful takeoffs and landings from the deck of the carrier. Prior to making the landings at sea, the student aviator must qualify on field carrier landing strips which simulate, on the ground, a carrier's flight deck.

Social Security Office Hours Now Longer

The Pontiac Social Security Office will be open up to 8:30 p.m. Wednesday evenings and until noon on Saturday for the next three weeks, William E. LaRock, District Manager announced today. The extended hours will begin this Saturday, December 4, and will continue through Saturday, December 12.

"I hope many people will take advantage of these special hours to file claims and get information about their rights under the new Social Security Law," LaRock said. "There are still many people in Oakland County who could qualify under the expanded Social Security Law who have not yet taken the necessary action."

THE NEW HEALTH Insurance program is probably the most important single change in social security, LaRock said, and there is a deadline date of March 31, 1966, for anyone age 65 or older. Health insurance is available for almost all residents of Oakland County in that age group, whether they have ever worked under social security or not, and even for those who have not yet retired, LaRock pointed out.

The regular office hours, 8:45 a.m. to 4:45 p.m., will apply to the rest of the weekdays during this period. The Pontiac Social Security Office is located at 35 E. Huron, and the telephone number is FE 8-4501. Anyone who cannot visit the office can get the help they need by telephoning or writing the office, LaRock said.

Local MSU Bandsman to Spend Christmas Vacation in Calif.

A Michigan State University student from Farmington will spend an expense paid Christmas vacation in Pasadena, Calif., with 175 other MSU students.

E. Larry Beaumont, who plays the trumpet for the MSU marching band, will fly with the band to Pasadena Dec. 28 to play at the Rose Bowl football game on New Year's Day. The band will also perform in the Parade of Buses preceding the game.

THE 175 MEMBER band will also give a concert and demonstration at Disneyland Dec. 30, said Leonard Falcone, MSU's director of bands.

The trip, which is sponsored by the Big Ten, appears to be a free vacation for the band members. "In one sense the trip is free," Dr. Falcone said, "but, besides the daily practice, which began two weeks before school started this fall, the band will have three days of intensive practice before leaving for Pasadena and three more days of practice after arriving in California."

of Mr. and Mrs. L. E. Beaumont of 32371 Queensboro Ave., is a freshman at MSU and is studying mechanical engineering. He is a 1965 graduate of Bedford High School in Bedford, Ohio. The band will return to Lansing Jan. 3.
