Daniel E. McDonnell, 19, is among the first to be accepted for admission to The University of Michigan Medical School for next year. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Edward J. McDonnell of 33727 Argonne in Farmington.

Mr. McDonnell is a 1963 graduate of Lee M. Thurston High School in Detroit, and is now enrolled in the U-M's College of Literature, Science and the Arts, where he won sophomore honors.

His class next year will number about 200 students, one of the largest medical school entering classes in the country. Of these, about 170 are from Michigan and the rest from other states and countries.

Successful students will receive their doctor of medicine degrees in 1970.
