aircraft carrier, USS America
for her first deployment with
the Sixth Fleet in the Mediter-
ranean.

America, the United States' newest carrier, will form the nucleus of one of the Sixth
Fleet's two fast carrier striking
groups. The Sixth Fleet operates
completely independent of
shore bases, getting its entire
support from seagoing service
units, including supply, ammu-
nition and repair ships.
