Farmington Sailor Serves on Carrier

Seaman Leo R. Rupp, USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. Elmer H. Rupp of 28730 Grand River in Farmington, has departed Norfolk, Va., aboard the attack aircraft carrier USS America for her first deployment with the Sixth Fleet in the Mediterranean.

America, the United States' newest carrier, will form the nucleus of one of the Sixth Fleet's two fast carrier striking groups. The Sixth Fleet operates completely independent of shore bases, getting its entire support from seagoing service units, including supply, ammunition and repair ships.

During her deployment, America will visit several Mediterranean port cities in France, Spain, Italy and other countries.
