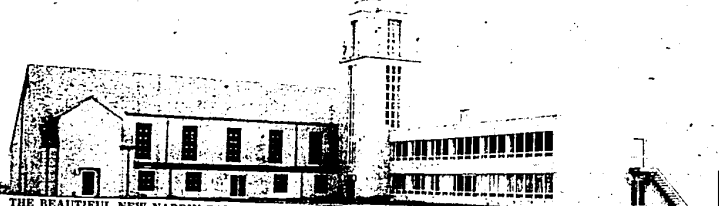

Safe Winter Driving Habits Urged by Local Police Chiefs

The season's first substantial snowfall revealed to some Farmington drivers their need to relearn safe winter driving habits lost during thousands of miles of carefree summer motoring. The two local Police Chiefs, Maurice D. Foltz of the City of Farmington and Chief Irving H. Yakes of Farmington Township, reported this week. In several parts of the City weren't as serious as they might have been," Chief Foltz said, "but I hope our next taste of winter will find us a little better prepared."

CHIEF YAKES added, "Stopping on packed snow, especially where it was polished down by skidding and spinning wheels to the smoothness of glass at the approach to intersections, was far more treacherous than some drivers anticipated."

Both Chief Foltz and Chief Yakes offered the following tips provided by the International Association of Chiefs of Police for future reference:

1. Check weather reports and adjust driving schedules to allow for reduced speed on slippery streets;
2. Allow considerably more distance between cars in traffic;

Mayor Issues 2 Proclamations
The month of January, 1966, will be "March of Dimes Month" and also "Marine Corps Reserve Civic Action Days" in the City of Farmington, by proclamations of the Mayor, W. V. Brotherton, at a regular meeting of the City Council on December 20.
The Council granted the request of the March of Dimes organization to distribute canisters in the City from December 18 to February 7, and place on Tuesday, February 1.
The Marine Corps request, also granted, was to encourage citizens to contribute to a fund for food, tools and medical supplies for Viet Nam children and civilians. There will be no direct solicitations, but envelopes for mailing of contributions will be made available by members of the Corps.

Serves Aboard Nuclear Ship, USS Enterprise

Aviation Electronics Technician Airman William R. Wichman, Jr., USN, son of Mr. and Mrs. William R. Wichman of 24081 Farmington Road, will always remember Dec. 2, 1965 - the day nuclear-powered warships were first used in armed combat against an enemy. He is serving aboard the nuclear-powered attack aircraft carrier USS Enterprise.

As the carrier Enterprise went into combat, launching air strikes against the Communist Viet Cong in South Viet Nam, the nuclear-powered missile frigate Bainbridge was again at the "Big E's" side, providing anti-air and anti-submarine defense for the world's largest aircraft carrier.

These two ships recently completed a 30-day, 16,000-mile transit from Norfolk, Va. to the Western Pacific to become the first nuclear-powered vessels to operate with the Seventh Fleet.

THE MOVEMENT OF Enterprise and Bainbridge to the Seventh Fleet was the first step in transferring the Navy's four atomic-powered surface warships to the Pacific Fleet. The nuclear-powered cruiser Long Beach and guided missile frigate Truxton will be transferred in early 1966.

The nuclear reactors in these ships provide almost unlimited range and the ability to stay at sea for extended periods without refueling. Without the need for constant refueling, they are a valuable asset to the Seventh Fleet striking forces operating throughout the Western Pacific.

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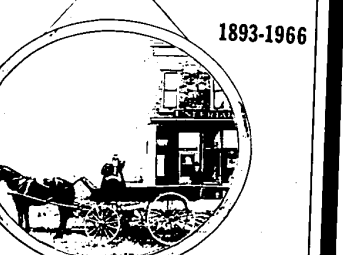
