Through their referral program all children who need any type of special help is directed to the proper source of help. The Casework Committee reviews all cases with the police, teachers and parents. The primary purpose of Youth Guidance is to prevent recurrence of juvenile misconduct. Youth Guidance is governed by the School Board, Township Board and Judge.

Interested parents are recommended to the March 2 General Meeting. Another interesting and extremely important topic, "Sex Education and Your Child," will be discussed by Dr. Donald F. Schroeder.

Costs Raised On Trash Pickups

The City Council, at a regular meeting on December 20, voted unanimously to increase payments to Gus McCreedy by \$100 a month for City trash pickups.

At McCreedy's request an auditor's review of his operating expenses showed that he has been losing money each month because of increased costs in disposing of the rubbish. In 1963, McCreedy had his own landfill operation; but it has since been closed, and he has had to pay \$400 a month to dispose of the rubbish collected.

City Manager Dinan stated that McCreedy's contract does not take into consideration any increase in population or pickups which have both increased considerably; and that even with the increased payment, the City will still be paying less than other cities for the same service.

The extra payment was made retroactive to December 1, through June 30, 1966, when the contract expires.

Table Request For Ball Field

A request by the Farmington Elks Lodge to tap into the City of Farmington's sewer system was tabled by the City Council at their regular meeting of December 20.

A letter from the Elks organization stated that they have an opportunity to sell property owned by them, on the east side of Orchard Lake Road between Shawassee and Ten Mile Roads, for use as general offices. Sale of the property, the letter continued, would make it possible for the Elks to purchase some City property that has been under consideration. Council members stated that, although the City has a policy regarding tie-ins of Township property, since the Elks organization is semi-charitable, the request should be considered. City Manager John Dinan was instructed to have the city engineers review the facilities, grade, and capacity in the area and report at the next meeting.
