Named Technical Divisions Assistant General Manager

The appointment of Bernard M. Salot of Farmington, Director of Technical Divisions, to the newly-created post of Assistant General Manager-Technical Divisions is announced by W. Groomes, General Manager of the American Society of Tool and Manufacturing Engineers.

An experienced industrial engineer, Salot is charged with the forming and implementation of, and staff liaison with, the Society's nine Technical Divisions, which represent the various manufacturing engineering disciplines embraced by the ASTME membership.

THE ASTME Technical Divisions are an efficient means of bringing specific, up-to-date information in particular fields to the technical specialists who need it for direct application in

manufacturing. Each Technical Division will operate as an autonomous organization of Society members sharing common interests in specific technical fields. The nine Technical Divisions are: Assembly; Casting; Molding and Metallurgical



Processing; Engineering Materials; Finishing and Coating; Material Removal; Inspection and Quality Control; Manufacturing Management; Manufacturing Systems and Material Forming.

Salot joined the headquarters staff of ASTME in December, 1964 as Assistant Director of Technical Divisions. Prior to that appointment, he was employed as a production engineer for Underground Products, Inc., and was active as a private industrial engineering consultant. He joined the Ford Motor Company in 1952 to coordinate methods, standards, process and material handling in paper manufacturing. While at Ford, Salot served as production analysis supervisor, and industrial engineering supervisor with responsibility for cost reduction programs and work standards negotiations with unions.

A graduate of John Carroll University, Salot is now completing work on a Master's degree in Business Administration at the University of Detroit. He makes his home at 2878 Raleigh Road in Farmington.

Farmington To Host County S.B.A.

The Farmington Public School District will host a meeting of the Oakland County School Boards Association tomorrow evening at North Farmington High School. The findings of a county-wide survey made in the last school census will be discussed.

The comprehensive vocational survey lists all existing vocational staff, facilities and studies presently available in 32 high schools in 29 school districts in Oakland County. The two remaining school districts do not have high schools.

A second part of the survey reveals the employment status and needs of 28,263 people between the ages of 14 and 50 in Oakland County.

Oakland County employers were asked earlier to supply information on the educational requirements, hiring practices and anticipated demand and supply of non-professional employees. More than 87 percent of the firms employing 100 or more responded. Of the small firms, 52.1 percent responded.

A vocational study committee will interpret the various reports and surveys so that local boards of education will be equipped to make recommendations for vocational education.

P-TA Language Classes Draw 117 at 10 Mile

French and Spanish classes begin at the Ten Mile Elementary School on Saturday, Jan. 22, with an enrollment of 117 children from second to sixth grades.

The P-TA-sponsored program attracted such widespread interest that four teachers will be employed instead of the two originally planned. President Don McGregor reported.

MRS. JOHN LOUIS, French teacher at Birney Junior High in Southfield, will instruct French classes, and Gary Winston of Farmington, former Ten Mile student and now a University of Detroit senior in language education, will teach Spanish. McGregor said the other two instructors will be announced later.

Parents of the children enrolled will be notified of the exact times and location of classes. The program runs 10 weeks.

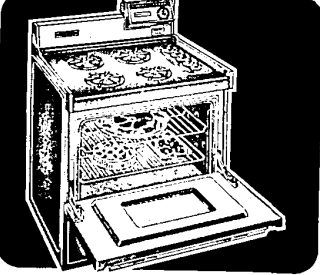

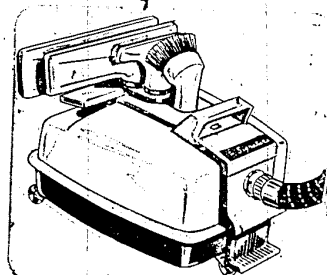
